The sheep arena will be in the pen area.

The 1958 National Southdown Breeders' Association Show with entries totaling 109 head, will open at 1 p. m., Tuesday, November 11. Extra premiums are offered by the association.

Extra Swine Pens

Swine entries have more than filled the Farm Show swine barns and out-of-door pens will be constructed to hold animals in the truckload show.

Many of the beef cattle will be outside at night. Herdsmen of the show-strings that ply the "big show" circuit have found that to avoid health problems and to keep bloom and finish on the animals, they must be tied-out at night. Special tie-out areas and

tents will be built to accommodate these animals.

Beef in Big Arena

Swine will be judged in the Farm Show small arena and beef cattle in the large arena.

Motor truck and allied manufacturers, realizing that nearly half their sales are to farmers or agricultural processors, will be showing their 1959 models at the Mid-Atlantic National truck show. Included will be cattle trailers, pick-up trucks and hydraulic equipment.

The only event during Exposition Week for which a ticket is needed and admission is charged is the Tommy Steiner World Championship Rodeo. Seven performances will be held in the large arena starting with a matinee on November 11, Veterans Day.

Dale Robertson, Oklahoma born star of "Tales of Wells Fargo," one of the better adult television

westerns, will appear at each performance. It is expected that 200 cowboys and cowgirls will compete for nearly \$15,000 in prize money. First to sign up was Jim Shoulders, Henryetta, Okla., who leads all others in the 1958 race for all-around cowboy honors. (Another story on Shoulders appears in this paper.)

Rodeo prize money is in addition to nearly \$80,000 being offered in the livestock shows. Judges will award 3,304 individual prizes and premiums in eight departments.

Junior steer show entries this year are heavier than in the 1957 show. Lancaster County's Red Rose 4-H Baby Beef and Lamb Club will be showing the largest group of animals from a single county. Other entries are from Maryland, Illinois, New Jersey, Ohio, New York and Pennsylvania.

Oklahoman Judges

Robert Totusek of Oklahoma State University, Stillwater, will pick the junior champion steer starting at 9 a. m., Wednesday, November 12.

At 1 p. m. the next day the junior champion will meet the open class champion in the large arena, again under the eye of Dr Totusek. He will select the Keystone International Grand Champion, an event that should provide one of the high points of the show.

Groomed for Show

Most of the 4-H Club and FFA showmen in Pennsylvania have fitted their animals especially for the Keystone International show. A year ago only a few animals were groomed especially for the new event. Many 4-H showmen have "buddy" steers at home that will be entered in the Farm Show Baby Beef in January.

Noon hour entertainment for Exposition visitors will be provided by units from the accompanying Armed Forces Show. Most notables are those to be presented Thursday and Friday.

On Thursday the Fourth Naval District band will give a concert in the large arena just preceding the selection of the Grand Champion steer. The band will remain in the arena throughout the afternoon and will provide musical interludes between other livestock classes. Another formal concert will be presented in the small arena at 6.30 p. m.

Naval "Fliers"

A trampoline demonstration will be staged Friday noon by Naval Aviation Cadets and a WAVE from the Naval Air Basic Training Command, Pensacola, Florida.

In the five day Armed Forces Show, the largest missile displays that can be squeezed through the Farm Show Building entrances will be seen along with exhibits and demonstrations by all branches of the armed services.

One of the unique Air Force exhibits will be the hitch-hiking 'Far-Side' missile. Designed to gather data on cosmic radiation and other conditions in outer space, the missile is raised to an

altitude of 20 miles by a balloon and then launched.

Missile Show Slated

Displays of the Army's Nike missiles, the only land-based air defense missile currently on-site and operational, will be shown.

Governor George M. Leader and Agriculture Secretary William L. Henning are honorary members of the big committee of the Livestock and Allied Industries Association that is sponsoring the Exposition in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

Leon Falk, Jr., Pittsburgh, and Polled Hereford breeder of Bedford County, who served as show chairman last year, is president of the association and has helped steer the coming show which all members anticipate will bring greater prestige to the Commonwealth's livestock industry.

William L. Medford, Chester, is show chairman and Ben Morgan, Penn State livestock specialist, is show manager.

The livestock phase of the Exposition ends at 8 p. m. Friday so that show herds may be moved to the Eastern National Livestock Show at Timonium, Maryland.

The truck and armed forces shows will continue through Saturday and the final rodeo performance will be Saturday night.
