Lancaster Exhibits Collect More Prizes at Timonium

TIMONIUM, Md., Nov. 20—Three young area stock fenders won four first prizes, in two steer and two lamb classes of the 4-H and FFA competitions at the 1958 Eastern Livestock Show here.

Thirteen upper division ribbons, ranging from second to fifth prizes, were won by seven other Lancaster area cattlemen at the show, largest of its kind in the east and among the top five shows in the country.

The three winners were: Wesley Mast of Elverson, Pa., first prize in the middleweight Angus class steer competition.

Fred Hess of Bareville, Pa., captured first prize in two lamb contests. One of his Hampshires took the heavyweight division title and a trio of his heavyweights won the top prize in the pens of three con-

test. Connie Quesenberry of Stewartstown, Pa., first prize in the middleweight Hereford class steer contest.

Other ribbon winners were:

Paul Mast of Morgantown, second and third place, heavyweight Angus steer; Darvyn Boyd of Ephrata and John Frey, of Quarryville, fourth and fifth places respectively in the same class.

Herbert Frey, Marietta, took fourth place in the lightweight Angus steer competitions.

Paul Mast took second

prize lightweight Hereford steer and James Quesenberry Jr., Stewartstown, placed third in the same class. Young Quesenberry also won second prize in the pens of five contest.

John McDowell, Mercer, took fourth place in the carload and fourth and fifth tries, in the pens of five places, with two separate engroup.

Fred Hess, winner of two prizes in lamb contests also captured third place in the Hampshire lamb show. David Johnson, Nottingham, won

third place in the mixed breeds pen of three and contest.

In the open classes of Angus Breeding cattle, two southeast Pennsylvania farms took first prizes in different contests.

Old Home Maor, Homer City, was the winner in the two-year-old heifer and Millarden Farms, Annville, Pa., first summer yearling bull.

Other ribbon winners in the breeding contest were:

Brookside Farms, White-marsh, second prize in the senior yearling bull and senior yearling heifer. Old Home Manor, second prize junior yearling bull and the Millarden Farm, second two-year-old bull, third prize summer yearling bull and fourth prize senior yearling heifer.

Easier Cooking

TURKEY COMES APART

The Poultry and Egg National Board and the United States Department of Agriculture have cooperated in developing a method for putting large turkeys (18 pounds and up) into parts before cooking. When the turkey is cut before it is cooked, the breast which requires longer cooking time is separated from the leg. The cook, then, is in control of the cookery and is not bound by the long-cooking and space-taking bird. The breast and legs of one or more turkeys can easily be roasted or steamed at yield-stretching low temperatures and shorter cooking times. This new quick method frees oven space for other menu items.
