parable period last year
Placement of broiler chicks in the 22 important broiler producing states totaled 27,171,000, up less than one per cent from the previous week and 11 per cent above the corresponding week last year. The indicated number for market about 10 weeks from now is 256 million, compared with 227 million last year.
The 22 state settings were one per cent above the previous week, and 15 per cent above the same week last

year. Total hatchings in the 22 states during the next 3 weeks will be 16 per cent above the same period last year.
Production of fall crop broccoli is forecast at 45,000 hundredweight for the state, 12 per cent above last year, but 34 per cent below average.
Nov. 1 forecast of early fall cabbage production in the state was 330,000 hundredweight, 38 per cent more than 1957 and two per cent above average.
Fall spinach production is forecast at 77,000 hundredweight, same as last year

but 36 per cent less than average.
A heavy state apple crop has seen drastically reduced prices as 6,400,000 bushels crowded the market. The crop was 230,000 bushels under 1957's total.
The Nov. 1 tobacco yield estimate remained unchanged at a record 1,750 pounds per acre. If realized, this average on 29,000 harvested acres will give a total production of 50,750,000 pounds of cigar leaf. This is 23 per cent above last year and 3 per cent above the average of the 10 years 1947-56.
The best crop in a generation in Lancaster County sold early and rapidly, because of its extremely high quality and poorer prospects in other cigar leaf production areas

week's close, and all of the decline came on Wed. Sows scarce but about steady. U. S. 1-3 grade 180-240 lb. barrows and gilts made 20 50-21 00, few lots No. 3 selling down to 20 00. Hogs more uniform for weight and grade weighing 190-220 lb. including 1-2 grade, 21 00-21 50 but on Mon they brought 21 50-22 00. 300-600 lb sows ranged between 15 00-18 50.
Receipts were very light in the sheep division this week with only about 415 head on sale compared with 563 head last week. Compared with last week's close woolled slaughter lambs sold at steady rates. Trading was active for the small supply Good and Choice slaughter lambs made 23 25-24 75, and Utility and low Good ranged from 19.75-23 50.
