

Name Smith, Hoover, Muth J-C Judges

Judges to select Lancaster County's Outstanding Young Farmer of 1958 were announced today by David M. Huber, chairman of the Lancaster Junior Chamber of Commerce committee now engaged in a search for possible contenders

The judging panel includes Max Smith, county extension agent; Richard Hoover, regional director of the Farmers Home Administration; and Martin Muth, SCS work unit conservationist.

Basis for the panels' judging will be nomination forms submitted by the general public. Winner will be the young farmer between the ages of 21 to 35 who has

made the greatest progress in his agriculture career, best practiced soil and natural resource conservation, and played the most responsible and contributing role in the community affairs and betterment.

Entry forms are available by contacting the Lancaster Jaycees.

A nationwide Jaycee project, the search for top young farmers is now underway in more than 1,500 communities in the 49 states and Hawaii. Lancaster County's winner will be sent to the state finals in Huntington, Pa.

The state winner will attend the national awards program at Cedar Rapids,

Iowa, for consideration as one of America's four outstanding young farmers of 1958

Milk Flow Smashes Existing Records

HARRISBURG — October milk production in Pennsylvania at an estimated 518 million pounds continued its record setting pace. Monthly records have been broken every month this year, with total production for the first 10 months of the year totaling 5,663 million pounds or a four percent increase over the comparable period of 1957, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

Pastures have held up longer than normal this season with the condition ranging from good to excellent, thus delaying the start of winter feeding of hay and roughage. Average pounds of concentrates fed per cow during October at 83 compares with 78 pounds fed during the previous month and 85 pounds during October last year.

There were 932,000 milk cows in the state herd, av-

eraging 556 pounds of production per cow, with 518 million pounds total production in the state.

Conditions of state pastures on November 1 was 86 on the index. Milk cows, on Oct. 15, were selling for an average of \$285 per head, butterfat was 53 cents per pound and milk wholesale was \$5.35 per cwt.

Average feed prices for 20 percent protein mix, and \$4.40 for 29% and over. Cottonseed meal was \$4.40; Soybean Meal—\$4.40, Bran—\$2.90; Middlings—\$3.05 Cornmeal—\$3.55; Alfalfa Hay baled—\$34.50, and other baled hay—\$27.50

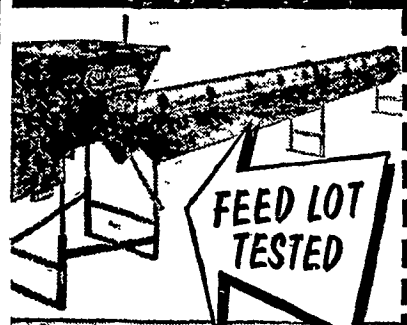
