

Eastern Area Broilers Off

Delmarva broilers at the week's end remained under severe price depression influence, as the bulk of sales were for less than 15 1/2 cents per pound. Only light weight broilers, for packaging were going for 16c.

Friday's market was steady, with offerings moderate and demand slightly improved. Prices at farm till 10 30 a.m. Friday, B&F, 2 1/2 lbs and over, mostly 3 1/4 lbs. and over, 13 20 - 16c 823,800 head including 523,900 head at Eastern Shore, 35% at 14 1/2 - 15; 25% at 15 - 15 1/2 Lght turkey fryers - 5,000 head at 24c.

The Friday Georgia market was very unsettled as a sharp difference of opinion exists within the trade as to actual market conditions. Offerings in fair balance with a generally good demand for live birds, at most points, though slightly short at others.

Broilers Gain Strength to 15.92

Thursday's Lancaster Poultry Exchange auction saw a slight increase in broiler average as the range went from 15 7 to 16 2, for a 15.92 median

Forty-three lots of poultry, with 130,405 head were offered, with 33 lots selling, totaling 112,105 head in the transactions. There were 21 lots of broilers with 102,400 head, eight lots of capettes, with 7,200 head, selling for 10 6 to 20 2 cents and four lots of 2,425 Leghorn fowl, bringing 11.1 to 11 9 cents per pound

Area Milk Production Steadies After Drop

PHILADELPHIA —Dec 5 FLUID MILK After a seasonal decline, production this past week had leveled off in most areas. Bottling demand was variable with prices an influencing factor in some instances, particularly in Boston where the state Milk Control Commission raised the retail store prices on larger than quart containers but decreased quart sizes

In the New York area prices declined 5c under the new milk marketing order effective Dec 1. For manufacturing purposes offerings were readily utilized by evaporators and separators. FLUID CREAM Fluid cream markets were generally well maintained as bottling demand held good in most areas. In some sections (Turn to page 5)

The Nov 28, Lancaster Poultry Exchange auction with 4,500 head, bringing 19.2 to 20 5, and one lot of leg-horn fowls, 600 head bringing 12 1 cents per pound.

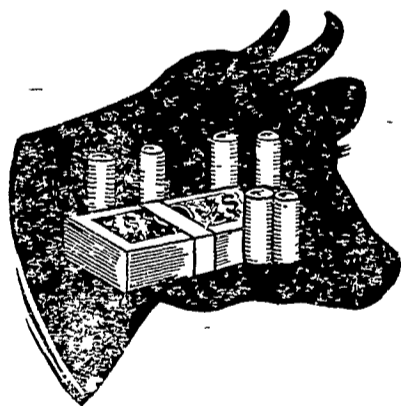

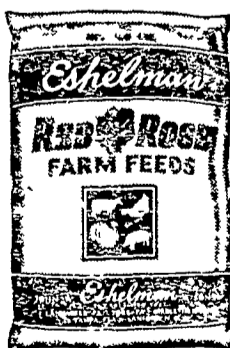
