In other areas throughout the N.E. demand was good with surplus adequate. Ice cream sales were also good with many quarters using available frozen storage stock either lieu of fresh or to reduce inventories before the end of the year.

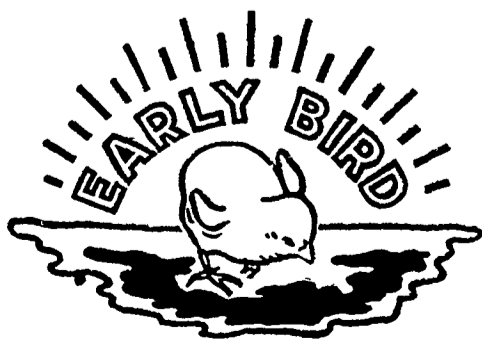
