**Interest Rates
On FHA Loans
Jump To 4%**

Washington, Dec 22 — The USDA has announced a new hike in interest rates for insured farm loans, effective immediately. The increase is to be from 3½ per cent interest with a one per cent service charge to four per cent interest with the one per cent service charge, which means insured farm loans will cost farmers five per cent of the amount borrowed.

The USDA's spokesman, Kermit H Hensen of the Farmers Home Administration, states the change was required by recent money market developments making 3½ per cent paper unacceptable to national lenders and to many banks and other local lenders.

This, together with the rapid obligation of direct farm real estate loan funds for the 1959 fiscal year, caused

ed funds to be adequate to meet credit needs of many eligible applicants.

The immediate effect of this will be for all insured farm improvement, enlargement and purchase loans made by the FHA to carry a return of four per cent instead of 3½ per cent to the lender, Hansen said.

The increase in interest rates is supposed to help activate legislation passed in the last session of Congress authorizing FHA to make

loans totaling up to \$5 million from an insured loan fund.

Loans made out of this fund may be purchased in blocks by investors. The fund can only be used when it appears that the loans can be sold without undue delay. The department estimates loans bearing a four per cent return will be saleable.

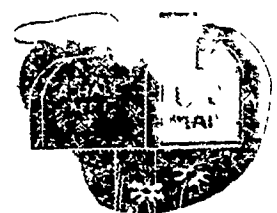
