taloupes (total ownership). He plans to fatten hogs this year, increasing from 32 head in his program. The list of his elected and honors totals 18 of importance, with many of lesser activities.

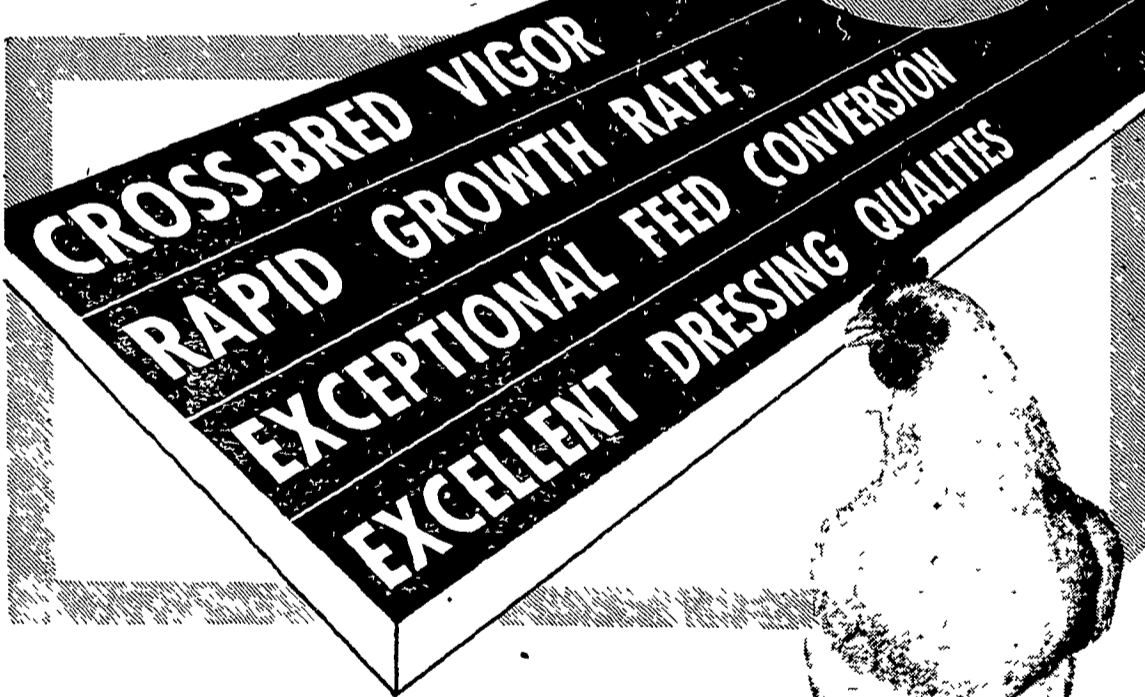
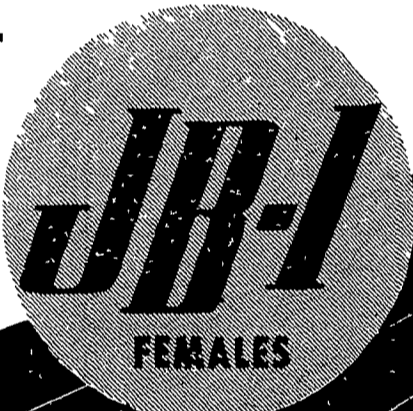
