1 p.m. followed by open class fat wethers and steers. The champion baby beef will be selected at 3 p.m. Thursday.

Farm Show Commission chairman William L. Henning, commenting on the lack of space for exhibits and livestock said, "The coming Farm Show will be the fourth since I took office in 1955. For each of these shows it has been necessary to turn away applicants for commercial exhibit space and for all species of livestock. The lim-

its of the poultry section have been reached.

"We had hopes for the erection of a new three-story addition to the building through an allocation by the General State Authority. It was estimated that as much as \$2 million would be required for such an addition, but we had to be content with lesser amounts for repairs and replacements that were absolutely necessary.

Henning said that the Commission will continue to work toward reasonable and practical expansions that will make the property usable for a greater variety of attractions to increase returns to taxpayers for their investment.

Space Was Short

Prospective livestock exhibitors also "got the axe" due to a lack of space. Dairy-men entered 567 animals in the open class, but only 454 could be accepted; 4-H dairy club members were cut five head to 175 and FFA exhibitors were cut from 33 to 25.

Of 309 head of swine entered, only 265 were accepted in the open classes and vocational agriculture students were lowered to 48 head from 57 entered. Horse entries totaled 105 but space was available for only 94.

Beef cattlemen and sheepmen fared better. All 299 breeding sheep, 103 4-H club lambs and 25 4-H breeding (Turn to page 16)
