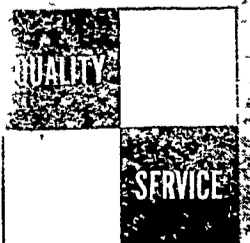

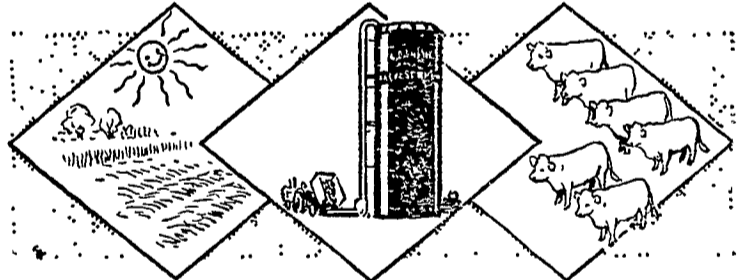
He plans to continue farming with his father after graduation, continuing and expanding his FFA operations.
