SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY for your son or daughter

Your son or daughter—or some other capable young person you know—could be one of six high school seniors who will fill places in Central Eastern Pennsylvania college classrooms this coming fall as winners of Pennsylvania Power & Light Company scholarships.
