

# Broiler Avg. to 21.04

Broiler prices at Thursday's Lancaster Poultry Exchange auction jumped another 1 1/2 cents over last week with the average hitting 21.04, on a range of 20.22-22.2.

Twenty lots with 87,235 birds were offered, with no options taken on only 10 lots with 1,600 birds. There were 19 broiler lots with 77,000 birds.

## Milk Market

Fluid Milk—Production in the N. E. was gen. unchanged to slightly higher. The exception was in New England where slight declines were reported. In most instances trend upward was lower than a year ago.

Demand was mostly fair except around Atlanta where improvement was reported. Offerings were ample, although lighter surpluses were being diverted into manufacturing channels. The wholesale selling price in New York per 40 qt. unit held unchanged at \$5.55.

Fluid Cream—offerings were irregular ranging from ample to just adequate. In the N.E. Pa. area insufficient offerings of Pa. & N. Jersey approved were readily supplemented by outside purchases. Bottling demand was fair.

Although offerings for manu. were relatively heavy they were lighter than last week. Demand by the ice cream industry was seasonally lighter resulting in some increased movement both to churns and freezers. Prices were unchanged to \$2.00 in Atlantic and unchanged to 25¢ lower on L. C. L. (Min. 50 cans).

Pa. & N. J. approved in the S. E. Penna area - wholesale selling prices per 40 qt. unit 40 PCT butterfat - N. Y. \$36.50. Manufacturing cream prices based on various formulas. Atlanta small lot sales \$22.00 - 27.00, mostly \$24.00. Boston spot sales and small lot spot sales (not available). Southeastern Penna open market selling prices Pa. and N. J. approved car or truck lot (Min 200 cans) \$25.00 - 26.00. L. C. L. (Min. 50 cans) \$25.75 - 27.50.

## Prices Rise

Delmarva's Friday market was firm, with reduced offerings and good demand. Some purchases on condemned deductions basis. Vol. and prices; 595,700 at 19.10 - 20.40, incl. 407,500 at Eastern Shore.

Georgia had barely adequate to short supplies Friday. Plants generally operating under condemned deducted basis. Total vol. includes about 17 per cent booked for Saturday. At farm: 910,200 at 18 cents; FOB plants: 499,500 at 19 cents.

Delmarva opened the week with a firm market, demand improved, Tuesday was quiet, and the market dropped Wednesday with increased offerings available. Market firmed Thursday, with heavy offerings and increased demand.

Mon. - Thurs. volume and prices; 700,300, incl. 466,800 at East. Sh. Exch., 15 1/2-21.10 mostly 19 1/2 and up; 266,300 18 1/2 - 20; 763,400, incl. 593,200, at East. Sh. Exch. 18.10 20.40, mostly 19 and up.

Georgia jumped one cent higher with offerings short, continuing through the week. Prices jumped another cent Wednesday and again on Thursday, bringing 96% of Thurs. sales at 18 cents.

Fri.-Thurs. volume and prices at farm: 992,900, 85% 78% at 16. At farm—691,400 at 15; FOB plants—535,100, 81% at 16; FOB plants—340,500, 17. Delmarva broiler feed ration for the week ending Jan. 9, was 3.4. Broiler prices averaged 16.42, 20% mash was \$97.50 per ton. The ratio for Dec. 22 - 24 was 3.2, the previous week—3.3, and one year ago—4.0.

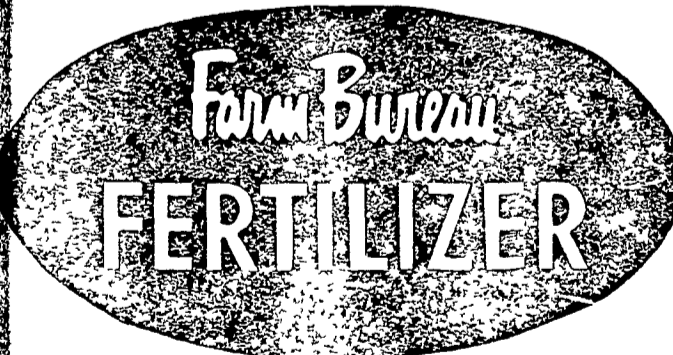
