The Delmarva Broiler-Feed ratio for the week ending Jan. 16 jumped to 3.9, after several weeks at 3.4 or lower. The broiler average was 19.17, while 20% mash was \$99.54 per ton. Total week's volume, 3,095,256.

Monday's mkt. opened fairly steady, demand fair to good. The market weakened through Wednesday, steadied Thursday. Some lots going on condemned deducted basis.

Volume and prices: Mon. - 524,000, incl. 416,700 at East Shore, mostly 19 - 20.30, 44 per cent at 19½ - 20. Tues. - 136,800 at 19½ - 20½. Wed. - 534,200, incl. 395,400 at East Shore, mostly 18½ - 20, 49% at 19 - 20. Thurs. - 643,800, incl. 398,400 at East Shore, 18 - 19.30, 59% at 18½ - 19.30.

Milk Market

Milk production continued its seasonal trend upwards although dependent upon weather conditions in some instances. However, this upward trend was below that of a year ago. Offerings were ample for a well maintained seasonal bottling demand. Surplus above Class 1 needs continued moving into manufacturing channels, especially for cottage cheese. The wholesale selling price was unchanged in N. Y. at \$5.55 per 40 qt. unit.

Fluid Cream: Offerings for

bottling purposes were ample to in excess of most requirements. Ice cream sales continued seasonally lighter, although irregular in many quarters. Manufacturing cream was also ample with a more active and increased movement to churns reported.

Prices in S. E. Penna. were unchanged to 25 cents lower on carlot sales to 50 cents lower on L.C.L. Sales. Other areas were generally unchanged.
