Rural Youth Awards are presented annually from a program established in 1953 when the Lancaster County Rural Organization disbanded. There is one award each for outstanding 4-H boy and girl, FFA member and girl.

Wayne Miller, Mount Joy, received the award as county 4-H boy. He farms with his father on the 160-acre family farm, which includes a steer feeding operation of nearly 100 head. He was top 1958 state 4-H livestock judge and a member of the 1955 county 4-H livestock judging team.

Bette Umble, 2350 Old Philadelphia Pike, is a junior at Conestoga Valley high school, state co-chairman in the bread baking demonstration, and a 1958 delegate to the National 4-H Congress.

Farm Labor Bill Goes to House

A Pennsylvania Grange supported bill to give the Pa. Dept. of Agriculture authority in farm labor legislation writing has been presented to the state House of Representatives.

The bill would require Agriculture department approval of rules and regulations governing farm labor.

Latest USDA Crop Reporting Board figures show that the number of cattle and calves on feed for market on January 1, was 6,489,000 head, largest on record for that date. This was an increase of 11 per cent from Jan 1, 1958 and compares with the Jan 1 average of 5,773,000.
