Delmarva - Georgia Mkt. Weakens

Delmarva's Friday market was steady to firm, offerings and demand increased. Volume and prices, 16 40-18, 880,300 head, incl 604,800 head East Shore, 17% at 16 1/2 17, 41% at 17-17 1/2 12% at 17 1/2-18, 19% undetermined.

Georgia's market on Friday found orders for processed birds spotty, increasing from certain areas of the country. Offerings more than ample to adequate. Volume incl approx 14% for Sat. Prices and volume: At farms, 15-16, 94% at 16, 818,700; F OB plants, 16-17, 85% at 17, 501,500 head.

The week's Delmarva market opened steady, with some purchases on condemned deducted basis. Market was quiet and trading quiet on Tuesday, weakening Wednesday and continuing weak Thursday under light demand. Condemned deducted purchases continued.

Volume and prices: Mon-759,600, incl 502,900 head at East. Shore, at 16 60-19 30, mostly 18 cents up Tues.—141,300, at 18 1/4 - 19, mostly 18 1/2 and up Wed—609,300 incl 141,200 at East. Shore at 16 3/4-19, mostly 17 and up Thurs—618,300, incl. 464,300 at East. Shore, at 15.20-18, mostly 16 and up.

Georgia opened with both offerings and demand light on Monday. Condemned deductions continue. The market was off one cent on Tuesday, light offerings in excess of lighter demand, continuing into Wed. as several plants closed and on Thurs. with prices off another cent as offerings exceeded demand.

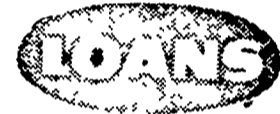

Delmarva weekly volume until Jan. 24 was 2,760,165.

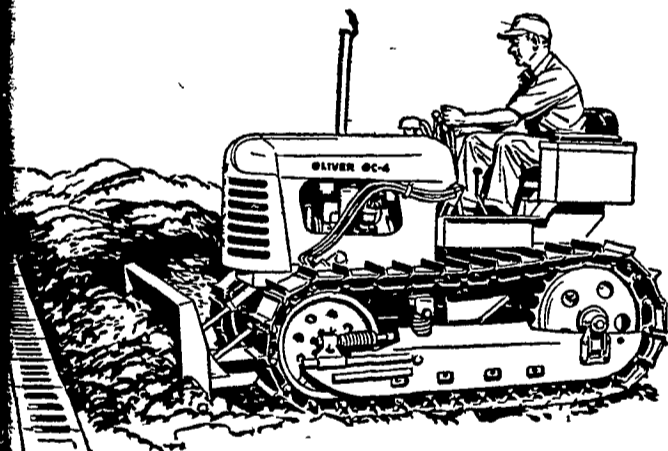
