Top Third at 18.41**

Today's average for 31 153,050 broilers on Lancaster Exchange was with top third of 51.7 cents averaging a third cent more at 18.41. Lots of 9,075 capettes in a range of 24-25.6, lots of 1,750 heavy ranged from 21.7-21.9, one lot of 900 leghorn brought 12.4. There were 43 of 48 lots with 164,775 birds. Year's corresponding had 25 lots with 62,375 selling, with a 20.92 average.

At 17 - 18c
Del. Closes**

Delmarva's Friday market closed firm, with brisk trading. Volume and prices, 736,000, incl. 485,700 at Eastern Shore, 16.20 - 18.10, with 61 per cent from 17 - 18.

Georgia closed with generally good weekend orders for processed poultry. Offerings clearing readily with balanced market. Vol. includes approx. 23 per cent for Sat. At farms, 1,035,800 head, 94 per cent at 15. FOB plants, 511,600 head at 16.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Jan. 30 was 3.7, off from the previous week's ratio of 4.0. Broiler mash (20%) was up to \$97.94 from 97.86, compared with 95.71 for last year, when the ratio was 4.3.

Volume for the week ending Jan. 31 was 2,814,995 head, up two per cent from the previous week, off two per cent from last year.

The Delmarva market opened Monday steady with light offerings, buyers slightly unsettled. Trading Tuesday was too light for a price report, and the market lowered Wednesday due to reduced demand. Market was firmer Thursday.
