

Lamb and mutton production was the second highest on record, but was down four per cent from the record set in 1957.

Red meat production in the United States during 1958 was five per cent below the volume for 1957 and totaled 24,394 million pounds.

The number of commercial cattle and calves saughtered in Pennsylvania during December 1958 was down six per cent and five per cent respectively from December '57. The number of hogs slaughtered was up three per cent. gamed two per cent for December 1957.


