Georgia's market closed with supplies well cleared. Total volume includes 22 per cent for Sat. Vol and prices, At farm, 16-17, 97 per cent at 16, 904,200 head; FOB plants 17-18, 95 per cent at 17, 530,800.

Delmarva's broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Feb. 6 was 3.5, against 3.7 the previous week and 4.4 one year ago. Broiler average was 16.97 and mash (20%) was \$96.76 per ton, compared with \$95.63 a year ago.

Delmarva volume for the week ending Feb. 7 was 3,227,532, up 15 per cent from the previous week.

Market opened firm on Monday, offerings up slightly over last week and demand improved. Tues. trading was very light but steady with firm market. Wednesday, weakening Thursday with increased offerings and reduced demand on unsettled background.
