of 3-18-18 fertilizer.

The financial report presented for stockholders' approval credited the county-wide co-op with a 1958 total business volume of \$4,309,108. Total gross income was \$635,028 and net savings to members were \$114,527.

End-of-the-year net worth for the organization was listed at \$1,006,000. Patron purchases for 1958 totaled \$3,978,085, while marketing volume was \$331,023.

The report was presented by Treasurer Harry R. Metzler.

By-law Changes

Various changes in the co-op's by-laws were reported by officials as being presented for clarification to layman's language, spelling out of director's and officers' duties, empowering the board to increase indebtedness and changing to comply with '57 changes to the Pennsylvania constitution. These require

membership voting on increases of capitalization and ban proxy voting.

Key-Note Speaker

Keynote speaker for the meeting was John Newlin, associate counsel of Interstate Milk Producers and a Blair county dairyman.

Newlin told the group that 87 per cent of the federal government's voting support comes from the city and there is where government will focus. Even USDA efforts are being aimed at the city and USDA news releases are at this moment hurting farmers.

"We must have greater buying power," he said, "and the only way we can get that is to organize and then organize our organizations."

"Government cannot correct inequities in the farm economy, even if it really tries. We've got to do it ourselves, by our own bootstraps and our own guts!"

over the loin edge and ribs, and patchiness around the tailhead. Cattle over 30 months of age have a thick covering of fat over the crops, back, ribs, loin and rump. The brisket, rear flank and cod or udder are well fitted and

distended. Cattle 18 to 30 months of age carry a moderately thick fat covering over the crops, back, loin, rump and down over the ribs. The brisket, rear flank and cod or udder show a marked fullness. Cattle under 18 months of age carry a slightly thick fat covering over the top.

Choice cattle usually have a moderately refined appearance but some coarseness may be evident in older animals.

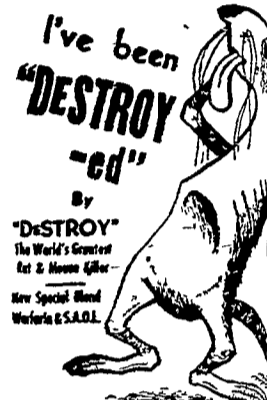
