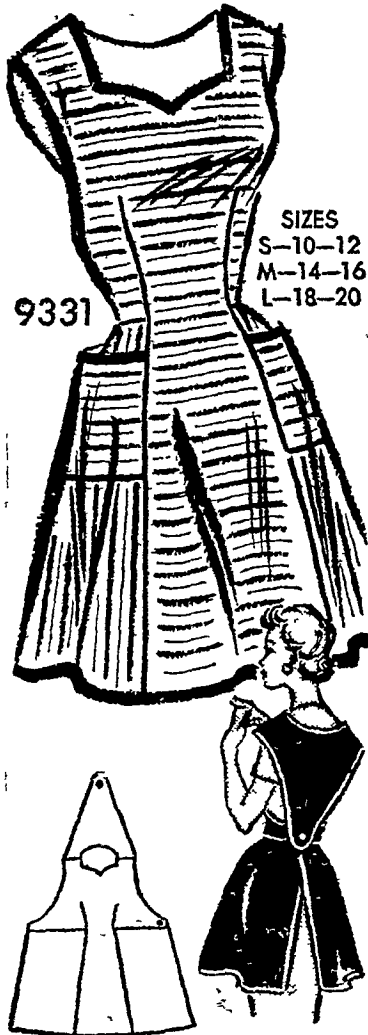
The society voted to "adopt" a Korean child, sending funds for his or her support and receiving information about the child. If possible, they will correspond.

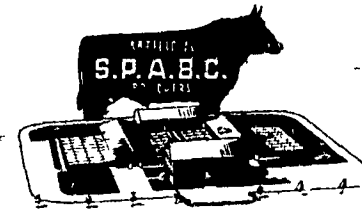

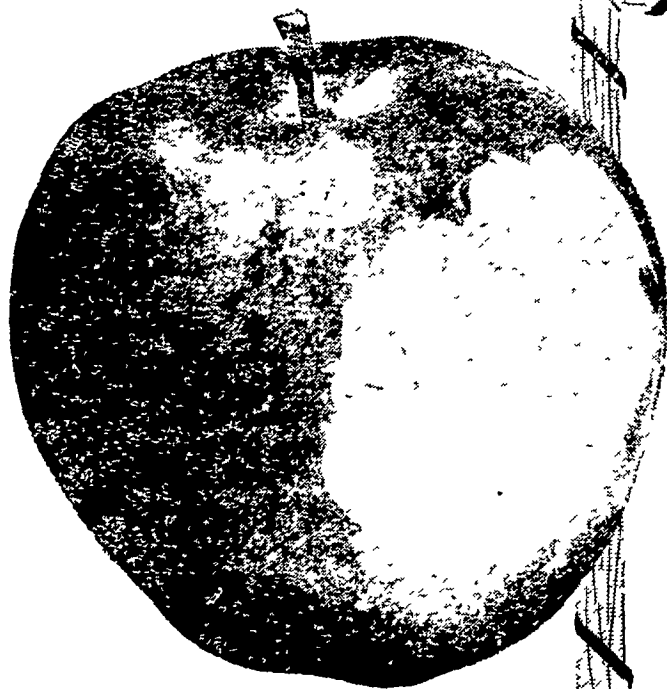
