The market opened steady for Delmarva with demand fair, prices mostly 16-17.25, continuing with quiet, steady market, firming Thursday, with Friday's prices mostly 17-18½.

Total volume for the week — 3,190,290.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Feb. 27 was 3.5. Broiler prices averaged 17.29, with mash at \$99.37 per ton. The previous week's ratio was 3.8 with 18.35 and \$97.29 for comparative prices.

The same week one year ago the ratio was 4.6 with broilers at 21.95 and mash at \$95.04.

Georgia opened Monday with offerings gen. adequate with good demand. Prices at farm were 94% at 15 cents. Demand improved Tues., with 91% at 15, 73% at 15 on Wed. and Thurs., and 99% at 16 on Friday assumptions were held closely and short at some points.
