Delmarva at 18

Delmarva broiler market opened firm with heavy offerings and good demand, 17.60-18.50 price range, with 64 per cent at 18-18½. Market weakened Wednesday, regained loss and climbed to strong 18.50-19.70 range on Friday report, with 52 per cent, 19-19.70.

The De'marva broiler-fed ratio for the week ending March 6, was 34, compared with 35 for the previous week and 48 one year ago. Average broiler price for the week was 16.92 with 20% mash at \$98.71, compared with 22.65 and \$94.92 one year ago.

Volume of Delmarva grown poultry for the week ending March 7 was 2,731,027; 581,977 live and 3,313,024 total This was one per cent below the same week 1958.

Georgia opened with short offerings and good demand with 92 per cent at 16 cents. Short supply continued, thorough moving into fair balance by Friday, with market closing with 94 per cent at 17 for the Friday at farm price.

Volume of Georgia poultry for the week (Fri.-Fri.) was, 4,051,600 at farm and 2,652,700 FOB plant.

1-2 grade 190-215 lb. 18-18.75, a few lots No 1 the same weight at 19, 230-250 lb. butchers made 16-17: 300-600 lb. sows made 12-15, few 600-650 lb. sows at 11-11.50.

Woolled slaughter lambs were steady to 50 higher on about 375 head. Trading was active. Good and choice slaughter lambs made 21.50-23, a few lots 80-96 lb at 23.50. Utility and low-good made 19.50-21.50.

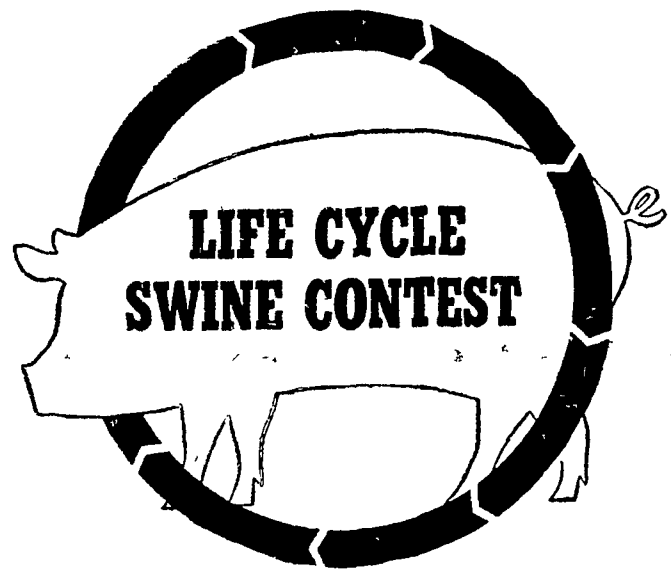
