and salt pork into bean pot. Add liquid mixture.

Cover, Bake in moderately slow oven (325 degrees) 1 3/4 hours. Uncover.

Lift pork to top of beans; bake 20 to 25 minutes to brown pork. Makes 16 servings.

★ **Sweet Potato Casserole**

3 1/2 cups mashed sweet potatoes

1/2 to 1/2 cup molasses

3 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted  
1/2 teaspoon grated lemon or orange rind  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
Marshmallows

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Combine sweet potatoes, molasses, butter or margarine, lemon or orange rind, and salt.

Add a little milk if potatoes are too dry. Pour into casserole. Top with marshmallows.

Bake 30 minutes or until sweet potatoes are hot and marshmallows have browned

Makes eight servings.

**Panned Glazed Ham**

Cook slices of ham or luncheon meat on both sides in heavy skillet until almost brown. Spread molasses thinly over each side; continue cooking until ham is brown.
