

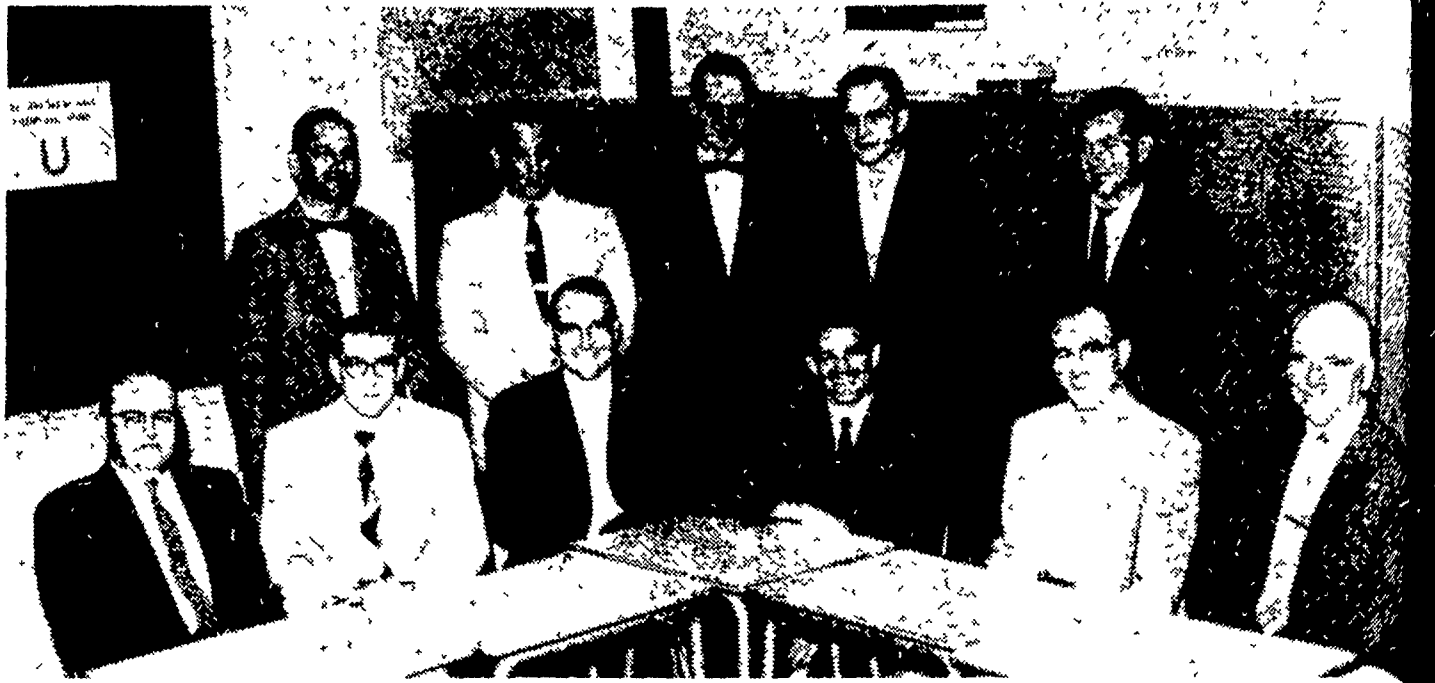
Ag. Profs Hear County 57-8 Report

Members of the Lancaster County Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association on Wednesday heard York-Lancaster District Voc-Ag Director T. M. Malin of York report a 1957-48 school year total labor income of \$86,776.99 for the county's 357 vocational agriculture students completing projects last year.

Net profit for the county's FFA members, before the addition of their own labor worth, was \$71,708.94 according to reports submitted by the instructor-advisors of the nine vocational agriculture departments in the county.

Swine projects topped the list for number of FFA members participating with 156 enrolled for '57-58, Malin reported. Poultry projects were second with 76; Corn, third with 72; Tobacco, fourth with 63, and Dairy fifth with 55 youths enrolled in projects
