The 1959 Lancaster County Homemakers' Day was conducted Wednesday in Blue Ball Fire Hall, with Penn State and County Extension personnel teaming with county homemakers to produce the event.

Chairwomen for the event were Mrs. Mark S Hess, of Lancaster RD 6 and Mrs J Everett Kreider, Quarryville RD 1.

Principal speaker was Miss Katherine Love, Penn State Consumer Information Specialist, speaking on "New Accents in Food Buying" Miss Love gave a background of farm consumer food buying trends and moved her discussion into the new food becoming available to the housewife

She discussed convenience food and new methods of packaging, stressing pouch and film packaging

An estimated 10,667 million lbs of milk were produced on farms in March. This was one per cent less than in March 1958, but six per cent more than the 1948-57 average for the month. Production per cow on April 1 by milk cows in herds of crop reporters averaged 21.76 lbs, an increase of four per cent over April 1 of 1958.

The rate per cow was at a record high for April 1 in all regions of the country, except the South Atlantic.

Of the more than 10 billion lbs of milk produced in March, nearly half was produced in these six states

Wisconsin, 1,606 million lb; Minn., 1,006 million; New York, 885 million; California 660 million, Pennsylvania, 595 million, and Iowa, 528 million lbs

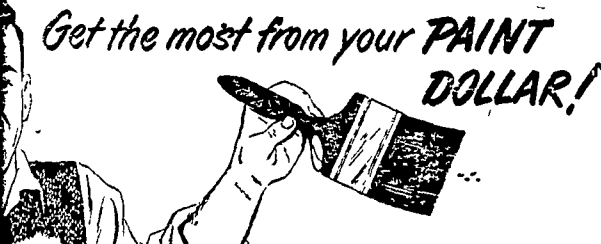
