LEON B EPLER, Northumberland farmer, Wednesday was elected to his 10th straight term as president of the Penna. Farm Bureau Cooperative Assn

Jacob N Smith, Annville, and Robert Leslie, Butler county, were reelected to the third terms as vice-president and secretary-treasurer, respectively.

A GROUP OF 50 County high school students toured facilities of seven local farmer cooperatives Wednesday during the annual Lancaster County Cooperative Council Career Day.

U S Hatcheries produced 14 per cent more chicks during March 1959, than March

1958, and 10 per cent more than the 1953-57 average for the month.

Chicks produced in the U. S for broiler production were up 20 per cent from March 1958.

Egg-type chicks produced were up six per cent.

Production for the first three months of broiler chicks was up 13 per cent from the same period of 1958.

Production of egg-type chicks during the January-March period was up three per cent

The number of eggs for broiler-type chick production which were in incubators on April 1 was 12 per cent above last year

Egg-type settings were a-

bout last the same as April 1, 1958

Cattle on feed in Pennsylvania on April 1 totaled 69,000 head, a 10 per cent drop from the 77,000 of Jan. 1. For the nine North Central Corn Belt states, the number on feed on April 1 totaled 4,262,000, less than one per cent below Jan 1 and four per cent above April 1, 1958.

For the 21 states in which most of the cattle feeding is done, the number on feed totaled 5,854,000 on April 1, six per cent below January.

In Penna, 20 per cent of the total for 30,000 head were over 900 lbs, 29 per cent 700 - 900 lbs and six per cent were under 500 lbs

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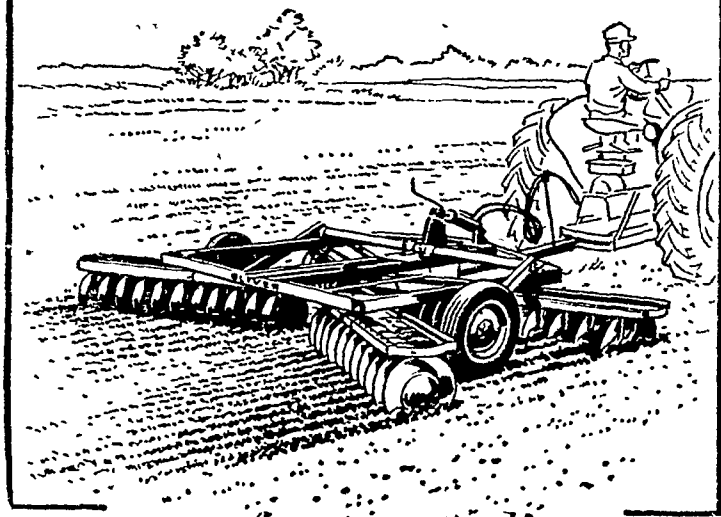
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### Senior Extension Plans Recreation
