In addition, normal cultivation of an infested field will spread the plant by distributing rhizomes. The seeds may be distributed in both small winter and spring grains as well as in sorghum, sudan grass and other seeds.

A tolerance of up to five seeds per pound of field seed will be permitted in Pennsylvania.

At present there is no practical herbicide to control Johnson grass according to Dr- Thomas L. Guyton, director of the Bureau of Plant Industry.

Twenty-seven other states, including Maryland and grants are available on the Ohio, classify Johnson grass as a noxious weed.
