If your white dacron curtains seem gray after two or three washings you'll need to be sure to do a thorough wash and rinse job in hot

If the curtains hang near forced air heat, they may have picked up an oil film th-

You may want to pretreat the curtains by making a paste of detergent and warm water and using this in soiled areas

If you wash the curtains with soap be sure to use water softener in both the wash water and the first warm rinse Rinse thooughly.

To remove grease spots from wall paper make a stiff paste of corn starch or fuller's earth with a dry cleaning fluid and coat the spot, then let dry.

Rub lightly to remove the soil You may be able to pick up some grease by putting a white blotter over the spot and holding a warm iron against the blotter.

Potash increases yields and prolongs the life of legumes. Two tons of good hay will remove from 60 to 70 lbs. of potash from the soil.
