

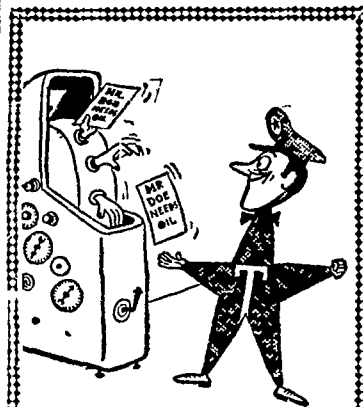
Chester County Dairyman Is U.S. Ayrshire Pres.

Penna. Watershed Flood Control Is Increasing

HARRISBURG — Pennsylvania's creek-size flood control program is gaining momentum, State Soil Conservation Commission Chairman William L. Henning said.

He made his comments following receipt of the ninth application for assistance with flood prevention filed with the Commission this year. It involves 130,544 acres in Fishing Creek watershed in Columbia County and is the sixth largest watershed application of the 38 under construction or consideration.

Fishing Creek is a tributary of the Susquehanna River with Bloomsburg as the lower limit of the watershed.

"This current flurry of applications shows that our small watershed projects are becoming a major flood prevention program," Henning said. "Trapping raindrops at

their source is the common sense place to start a control project."

In a small watershed project farmers are given assistance in conservation planning, thus reducing erosion, silting and flash flooding.

Normally recreational advantages are obtained as area becomes better for wildlife and fish production.

The federal government through the U. S. Soil Conservation Service, provides technical and engineering services and pays for the construction of flood prevention phases of the projects.

The Fishing Creek project is sponsored by Columbia County Board of Commissioners and the Columbia County Soil Conservation District.

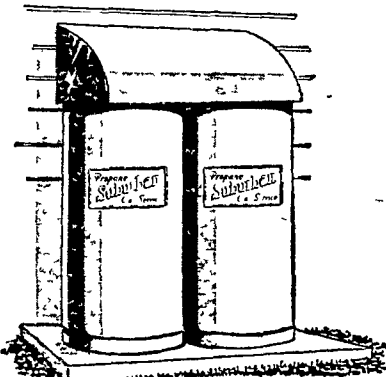

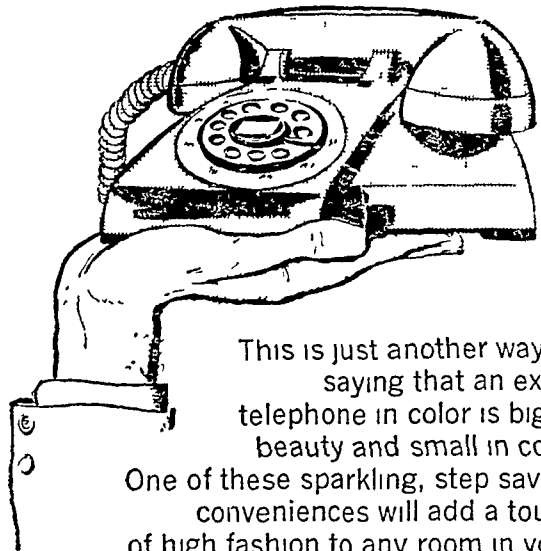
