CONTROL CUTWORMS

Where plants are already set in the garden some protection from cutworms may be obtained by dusting the soil around the base of each plant, says J. O. Pepper, Pennsylvania State University extension entomologist. Use 5 per cent DDT or chlordane or 2½ per cent heptachlor dust.

Blend soup and milk; stir in tuna, peas, and 1 cup potato chips. Spoon into a 1-quart casserole. Sprinkle top with remaining potato chips. If desired use whole chips on top of casserole rather than crumbled. Bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees) about 25 minutes. Makes three to four servings.

Deep Dish Chicken "Pie"

1 can (10½ ounces) condensed cream of celery soup
 ½ cup milk
 ½ cup cooked peas
 1 tablespoon finely chopped onion
 Dash black pepper
 1 Cup packaged biscuit mix
 ½ cup milk

Blend soup and ½ cup of milk. Add chicken, peas, onion, pepper. Spoon into a 1-quart casserole. Combine biscuit mix as directed on package; drop by spoonfuls onto chicken mixture.

Bake in a very hot oven over (450 degrees) about 20 minutes, or until biscuits are lightly browned and sauce is bubbling. Makes four servings.

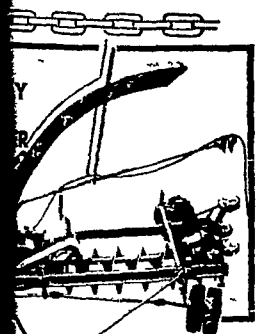

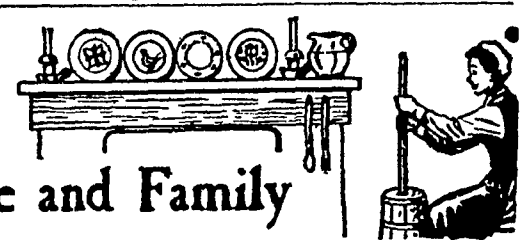

er; Helen Musser, Mt. Joy RD 2, and Linda Stehman, Florin, game leaders.

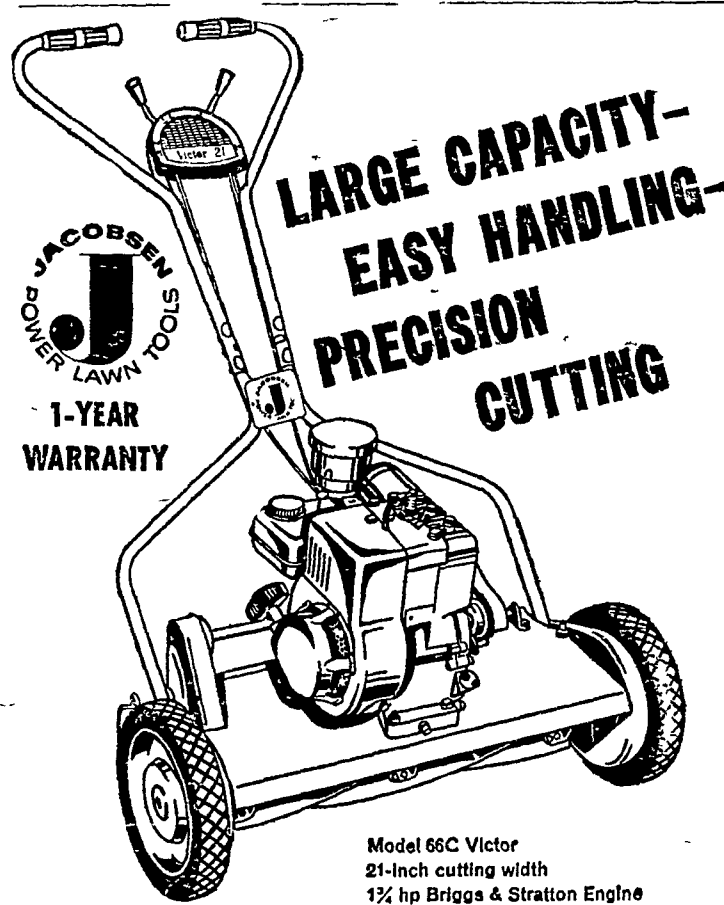
