## Sloat Urges Early Spray On Tomatoes

Associate County Agent Harry S. Sloat warned tomato growers this week that some early or Alternaria blight is present on some tomato plants in most fields.

In addition, he said, pink potato aphids and green pea aphids are rather heavy in many fields, and rapidly increasing in number. Corn borer moths are emerging at this time and flea beetles also are active in tomato fields.

Sloat recommends application of first spray at once, with repeat spraying at eight to ten day intervals, dusting at five-day periods.

Spray materials include two lbs of Zerlate, Ziram or Maneb; three lbs of 50% Mefhoxychlor and two lbs 25% Malathion WP.

Zerlate gives best control of early blight, aids in setting of fruit and early ripening. Malathion is for aphid control and Methoxychlor is for flea beetle and corn borer moth control. (One pint of Nicotine Sulfate may be substituted if Malathion is not available.)

Dust 10% Zerlate, and 4% Malathion, at 30 lbs per acre (Malathion can be omitted after first spray, if aphids appear to be cleaned out).

Farmers should thoroughly cover leaves, stems and fruit with spray or dust. Good coverage is essential at all times to prevent disease spores from entering and affecting the plant, Sloat pointed out.

"Farmers should be extra careful to avoid contamination of streams, ponds, or water supplies with spray materials," Sloat stated. Also, burn all paper containers as soon as empty."

## Tree Growers Demonstration

A special tree-trimming demonstration for growers of Christmas Trees is scheduled for 9 a.m. June 2nd on the farm of Kendrick Esbenshade, Bird-In-Hand RD 1, according to Harry S. Sloat, associate county agent.

Ed Farrand, forestry extension specialist will be present to give the demonstration and discuss other timely production practices.

J. O. Pepper, extension entomologist, will discuss various insects affecting evergreens and their control.

Sloat pointed out, announcing the meeting that proper care and shearing of growing trees will offer greatest returns from plantations. Christmas Tree operations have been very favorable in recent years and time spent in pruning and management will certainly increase growers' incomes, he added.

The Esbenshade farm may be reached by driving east on Pt 340 (O'd Phila. Pike) to Bird-In-Hand, turning north after crossing under the railroad past the Brubaker Duck farm to the first right turn and to the first farm on the left.

## USDA Sets Added Dry Milk Program

USDA has announced that offers have been requested to supply approximately 73,304,800 pounds of nonfat dry milk for USDA domestic and foreign donation programs.

Of this quantity, approximately 3,304,800 pounds will be packed in 4 1/2-pound bags and cartons for donation through domestic outlets.

Of the remaining quantity approximately 65 million lbs will be packed in 4 1/2 pound bag and cartons and five mil

lion pounds in No. 10 cans for donation to U.S. welfare organizations abroad.

The nonfat dry milk for domestic use will be offered during the August 17-19 period. For foreign donation, delivery will be as soon as possible for shipment by Sept. 11.

LAST WEEK the accepted bids to buy 628,350 lbs of dried egg solids, the equivalent of about 62,835 cases of eggs.
