Farm Storage Is Increasing

More than 10 million bushels of grain storage capacity was placed on the Nation's farms in the first quarter of 1959 as a result of the Department of Agriculture storage facility loan program, according to Landis G. Becker of the Lancaster County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation office.

Storage facility loans totaling more than \$2,000,000 were made during the January-March period to approximately 2,700 farmers, Becker said. In addition, 182 farmers borrowed a total of \$268,000 to finance mobile crop drying equipment for use in connection with storage facilities.

Loans for up to 80 percent of the cost of grain storage facilities are available through Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation offices to help farmers meet the needs for farm grain storage.

Since this program began in 1949, the loans have been used to add 412 million bush. to the Nation's storage capacity and to install drying equipment valued at more than \$5,000,000.

This Week in Washington

Freedom Academy

Bills before the Senate and House to create a Freedom Commission deserve the thoughtful study of everyone who values his freedom under our democratic system of government.

The naming of such a Commission would be the first step toward the creation of a national Freedom Academy that would have the same status as the military and naval academies at West Point and Annapolis.

The purpose of such an Academy would be to train "freedom fighters" of the Free World to "battle conspiratorial, organizational and operational techniques of Communism."

Bills to establish the Commission and Academy are sponsored by Sens. Karl Mundt (R., S.D.), Paul Douglas (D., Ill.), Clifford Case (D., N. J.), and by Reps. Sydney Herlong (D., Fla) and Walter Judd (R., Minn.).

A Third Front
The Communists are waging the cold war on three fronts — military, economic, and propaganda. The last is the only one on which we are doing an ineffective job of defending democracy.

"While the Free World has developed a powerful defense establishment to prevent a 'hot war'—or fight one if attacked—we have tragically ignored in great measure the political battlefields of the cold war," Sen. Mundt points out.

On the military front, the Communist nations and the Free World are rated by many experts as about even-up. The economic strength of the Free World is undeniably superior.

Russia's superiority in the use of propaganda is also acknowledged. The Kremlin spends billions of dollars to train propaganda agents and to finance their infiltration into the Free World nations. We have taken no effective countermeasures.

Fifth Columnists
For every Kremlin-trained agent in the Free World there probably are hundreds of "fellow travelers" who form an extremely dangerous Communist "fifth column."

Sen. Mundt said in a recent Senate speech that communist agents "have infiltrated our universities, our cultural and religious groups, our labor and farm organizations, our newspapers, radio-TV and movie industries."


Sponsors of the bills say the purpose of the Freedom Academy would be to train students "as to the methods of communists, and learn techniques to effectively counteract communist tactics which make use of infiltration, propaganda and espionage."

"It is not" Mundt explained, "our intention to emulate the communist conspiratorial techniques in conducting our side of this cold war into which we have been reluctantly but realistically forced."

"Our methods and techniques can and should be developed in full harmony with our democratic principles, our Christian ethics, and our civilized concept of morality."

"With right on our side, we should be able to involve methods and techniques far more effective than those utilized by the communists to exploit those with whom they come in contact."

IS THERE one sin from which all other sins come? Many theologians think there must be; but they do not all agree on what sin is the root-sin of all the rest. One sin which has been singled out for this doubtful honor has been called "the lust for power." It is not wrong to desire power; otherwise Jesus would have severely condemned the two disciples who wanted to sit on thrones at his right and left. It is not wrong to wish to influence other persons, otherwise it would be a sin to run for president of anything. Nevertheless, desire for power can be so exaggerated that it becomes a passion, a soul-destroying passion.

Law and the Lust for Power

There is a first-class example of how the lust for power can run away with a man, an example of how other sins are spawned by this one, in the Bible story of King Ahab and the private citizen named Naboth. Nearly all readers of the Bible know this story, and those who do not know it should look it up (see the references given here), for it is a dramatic story. King Ahab was of course one of the wealthiest men in the kingdom. He had all he needed and more besides. But he wanted the vineyard of the small farmer Naboth. He wanted it so much that he was willing to break the law of the land, he was willing to go even as far as murder, to get what he wanted.

Ahab could never have got that vineyard by legal means. If Naboth did not want to sell, there was no law to make him. More than that, according to the law of those times, Naboth was required to hold on to his property. Ancient Hebrew law saw to it that every family was provided with land, and must

TO PREPARE GRAIN BINS—grain harvest is approaching and age bins should be cleaned and the control of grain insects. One main source of infection in the old grain left in the bins or cracks and crevices of the building grain should be cleaned out and possible, or fumigated if any ammonia held over. Then the bin should be sprayed using either one quart Methoxychlor or one pint of 572 thion per 2½ gallons of water used square feet of bin surface. This should be done days prior to the filling with new grain so that it will be dry.

TO GET THOSE WEEDS—Many of the common annuals that reproduce seeds for new growth are not mowed prior to heading. One of the easiest control these weeds is to prevent them from growing this year; that will remove the chances of more weeds next year. In many fields and pastures mowing four to six weeks during the season will give good results. The spraying with 2, 4-D or other chemicals will not only the plant but in many cases destroy the root. The amine form of 2, 4-D is the only safe one for the control of weeds on their land. With noxious weeds such as Canada Thistle Pennsylvania laws demand

TO ROTATE SHEEP PASTURE—One of the problems in sheep production here in the east is worms; with high temperatures and high humidity eggs survive for long periods of time. This requires a system of pasture rotation if the flock is to be freed from these worm eggs. The grazing area should be divided into several parts so that the sheep are moved one to the other at three to four week intervals. This problem can become very serious where a large number of sheep are grazing on a limited acreage constantly out the season year after year. The salt-phenanthrene should be kept before the flock at all times as a preventative measure.
