## Wagon Drying of Crops **Best In Enclosed Shed**

Wagon drying of crops holds great promise for the future, research engineers at the Pennsylvania State University report

William L Kjelgaard and hay Morris E Schroeder point to the flexibility of wagon dry- 140 to 160 degrees Fahrening in especially enclosed heit buildings. Crops can be baled, bagged, or in bulk.

On the basis of research at Penn State's Agricultural Experiment Station, Kjelgaard and Schroeder recommend the wagons be located in a closed shed to permit recirculation of air.

This will improve the drying efficiency and lower the fuel cost per ton of hay or bushel of corn.

-Air recirculation is most valuable during the latter part of the drying cycle when the air leaving the product is not fully saturated with water vapor.

The building also serves as a storage place for equipment and other farm machinery or products during the winter season.


