Removing asters and gold-  
enrod from the area where  
susceptible pines are growing  
will break the life cycle of  
needle rust, explains Allen,  
Bauer, Penn State extension  
plant pathologist. Cultivated  
asters should be sprayed with  
Zineb or captan every seven  
to ten days as long as rust is  
present.

REPORTS FROM USDA  
crop correspondents through-  
out the country show that mil-  
k cows in their herds pro-  
duced an average of 24 59-lbs  
of milk per cow on June 1.  
This was two per cent above  
last year's high for the date.  
Production was at record le-  
vels per cow in all regions.  
The total milk produced on  
farms in May was 12 595 bil-  
lion lbs, one per cent below  
May 1958, but one per cent  
above the 1948-57 average.  
A total of 53 5 billion lbs. of  
milk were produced in the  
first five months of 1959, ab-  
out 230 million lbs or one-  
half per cent less than the  
same period of 1958
