CATTLE - Receipts about 15% smaller than last week but fully 5 per cent greater than corresponding week a year ago, uneven distribution of supplies with better than 50 % of the weeks arrivals here on Monday, in addition the salable supply that day increased by around 500 head slaughter cattle carried from last week.


