
Whenever he can; he points out, "Its much easier to farm on the contour. Working on the level, it takes a smaller tractor to do a better job of a given operation."

"On this one field, we've seen conservation triple the production. In tobacco this year, we can tell the value of conservation holding ALL the rainfall. The water stays where it falls, to raise crops, instead of running off to dig gullies.'

"As township supervisor, I can really tell the difference where conservation is being followed. Less dirt, if any, has to be removed from contoured Bridges overflow less, if at all, on roads below land that is farmed with conservation pračtices.
