

M&B Plans Expansion

Miller & Bushong, Inc., of Rohrerstown, manufacturers of Early Bird feeds announced to Lancaster Farming, early this week, plans for construction of additional feed milling and mixing facilities at their Rohrerstown headquarters.

Chester Graybill, president of the firm, reported that the new facilities will be housed in a compact, 97-foot high "push button mill", which will be the area's most modern milling plant.

The operation will include large gravity flow bins for whole grains, concentrates and other ingredients, with outlets from the milling and pelleting equipment to the bulk loading area and packaging plant in present facilities.

Miller & Bushong was founded by Harry C. Miller at what is now known as the Binkley Mill, in 1875, on the Old Harrisburg Pike.

W. Scott Bushong joined the firm in 1898. In 1919, Graybill joined Bushong, following Miller's retirement.

The firm's mill was destroyed by fire in 1941, after which the present mill was constructed.

U.S. Calf Crop 2% Above 1958

The 1959 U.S. calf crop is expected to total 41,328,000 head, two per cent greater than 1958, and seven per cent above the 10-year average according to the USDA.

This is the first increase from the previous year, since the record crop of 42,601,000 head in 1954. The calf crop in the 11 Western States is estimated at three per cent higher than a year ago.

The North Central states expect a one per cent increase and South Central, four per cent North Atlantic states expect a slight drop.

The USDA has recommended a three per cent cut in acreage for 1960-crop winter vegetables for fresh use.

Recommended acreage cuts include:

Cabbage, escarole and green jejjers, all 15 per cent. Increases in tomatoes, 15 per cent; snap beans, 10%, and cucumbers, 65%, are urged by the USDA.

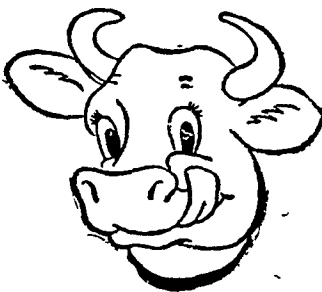

First Half '59 Milk Prices Up

Milk for fluid use averaged higher in price in early July at both producer and consumer levels, USDA reports.

Dealer prices were higher in about one-third of the U.S. markets reporting. Prices paid by dealers for milk for fluid use in early July averaged \$5.28 per hundredweight in about 60 markets. This was an increase of 19 cents from June and 25 cents from July 1958. The average price of a quart of milk to homes in 25 markets was 25.5 cents. That was 2.5 cents above June and 1.5 cents more than July ago.

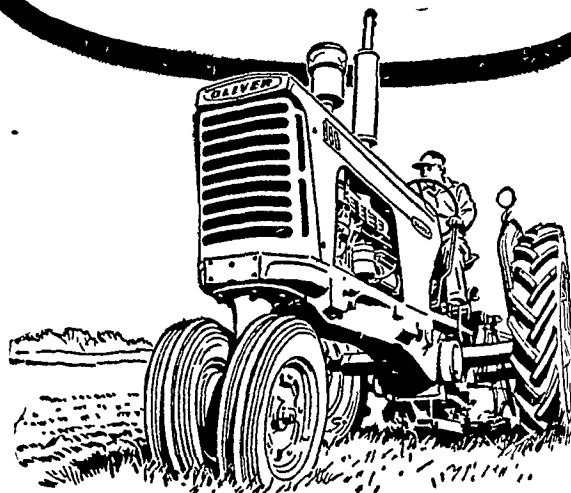
