Chester Graybill, president of the firm, reported that the new facilities will be housed in a compact, 97-feet high "push button mill", which will be the area's most modern milling plant.

Miller & Bushong was founded by Harry C. Miller at what is now known as the Binkley Mill, in 1875, on the Old Harrisburg Pike.

W. Scott Bushong joined the firm in 1898. In 1919, Graybill joined Bushong, following Miller's retirement.

The firm's mill was destroyed by fire in 1941, after which the present mill was constructed.

U.S. Calf Crop 2% Above 1958

The 1959 US calf crop is expected to total 41,328 000 head, two per cent greater than 1958, and seven per cent above the 10-year average according to the USDA.

This is the first increase from the previous year, since the record crop of 42,601,-000 head in 1954. The calf crop in the 11 Western States is estimated at three per cent higher than a year ago.

The North Central states expect a one per cent increase and South Central, four per cent North Atlantic states expect a slight drop


