

Broilers Continue Steady

Lancaster Poultry Exchange market held steady Thursday in the threatened area with mounting concern the possibility of a glut of poultry if the strike devel-

There were 44 lots offered, 2,715 head; 38 lots, 2,240 head, sold. Broiler average was 17.37 on 25 with 68,155 head. Top of the broilers, 22,700 averaged 17.65. The range was 17-18.8.

Geo. Closes Stronger

Delmarva closed Friday with 795,700 head at mostly 16-16.8. Est. slaughter for Fri. & Sat., 623,800.

Georgia closed with 1,417,000 head at 15.0, Est. slaughter for Fri. & Sat., 1,809,000. Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for week ending Aug. 14 was 3.3, compared with previous week's 3.4. Broiler avg was 16.48, mash was \$98.91 per ton.

Delmarva's volume for the week was 2,347,000, with market at steady 16-16.9. Georgia's weekly volume was 1,947,000 head, at 14.5-15.4, up to 14.5-15.9, dropping to 14.5-15 range.

RED MEAT production by 44 major producing countries was 95.5 billion lbs. in 1958, according to the USDA. This was less than one per cent above 1957, but 17 per cent above the 1951-55 average.

Declines in North and South America offset gains in other areas. Pork production was four per cent greater than 1957, beef and veal production declined four per cent and production of lamb, mutton and goat meat was up seven per cent.

Total meat production in 1959 for the world probably will be substantially greater than 1958, it was predicted.

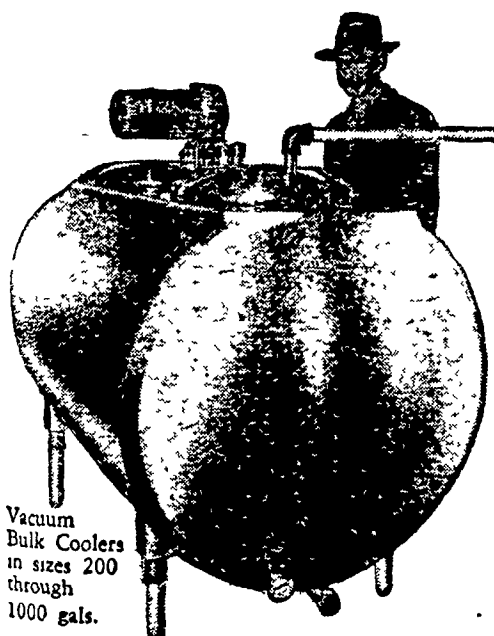

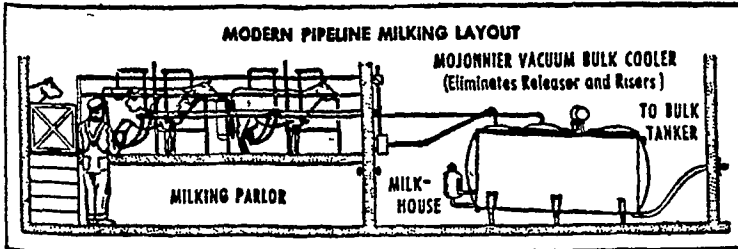
