# Deadline

Thursday, September 10 is the last day farmers can take the first necessary step to participate in the Soil Bank's 1960 Conservation Reserve program, Earl Groff, Chairman of the Pennsylvania Stabilization and Conservation Committee, said today.

The first step is for each tarmer who wishes to offer cropland under the program to ask the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee to set a basic annual rate per-acre for the land offered.

The period for filing such requests is from August 24 through September 10. The Chairman emphasized that ed after September 10.

After the basic rate has been established for the land have an opportunity to apply for a contract at any figure below the basic rate.
