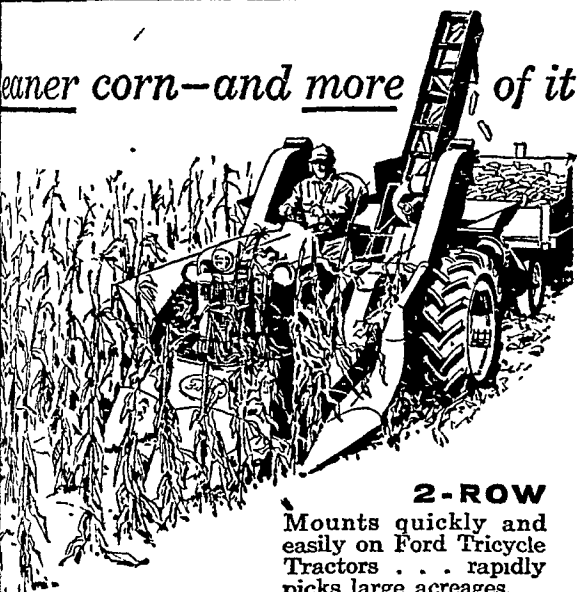

## Cloudy, Humid Weather Remains on Area Scene

HARRISBURG — Some apples are being picked in all major producing areas of the Commonwealth, the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service said Tuesday in a summary of crop and weather conditions for the week ended August 31.

The apple crop is described as "clean, good sized, fairly well colored and of good quality" by the State Dept. of Agriculture agency. Principal field activities during the week were cutting corn for ensilage, plowing for fall seeded grains and progressing rapidly. Plums, grapes and grapes are being picked and are maturing rapidly.

has passed its peak. Some farmers are husking early corn in southern counties. Small grain harvest is virtually completed throughout the state. Buckwheat and soybeans are growing well.

There is some concern about tobacco shed-burn due to poor curing weather for the cigar leaf in Lancaster County.

About half the acreage has been cut with the crop consisting mostly of large leaves which have good weight.

Pastures have been helped by recent rains and in some areas are normal for this time of year. Some early grass seedings did not germinate due to dry weather and are being reseeded.

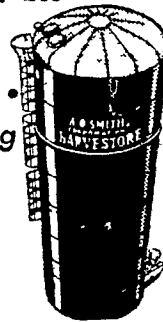
