

Out-of-State Herds Dominate Pennsylvania Guernsey Show

A three-year-old cow, exhibited by a St. John's breeder, Tuesday won grand championship honors at the 10th annual Pennsylvania Guernsey Show.

She was Dumar Farm P. H. Lillian, bred and shown by George W. Snyder, owner of Dumar Farm.

Enroute to the title, the prize Guernsey also picked up senior cow championship honors, in addition to taking first place class honors.

The reserve grand champion also came from the three-year-old competition.

She was Welcome C. G. Wistful, exhibited by F. W. McCann and Joseph E. Adams, Golden Harvest Farm, Bridgewater, Conn.

The reserve titlist was bred by Willard H. Peck, of Schylerville, N. Y.

It was the first time in three years that an entry from Lauxmont Farms, Wrightsville, failed to win the female grand championship.

Animals from the farm of Dr. George T. Pack won the dosette in 1957 and 1958

Meanwhile, a four-year-old bull, exhibited by Mrs. Clifford L. Conover of Hightstown, N. J., won both senior and grand champion honors.

The bull, bred by J. M. McDonald, Cortland, N. Y., bested the junior champion, entered by the Lehigh Valley Cooperative Farms, Allentown, for the top title.

Closest Lancaster County entry to a championship came in the senior heifer class, where a 4-H Club animal exhibited by Karl Bender, sixteen, won first place.

The 11-month-old calf was shown in the ring by Robert Mumma, seventeen, whose father bred the heifer.

Close to 200 head of Guernseys were shown by exhibitors from a five-state area at the Guernsey Sales Pavilion, Lincoln Highway East.

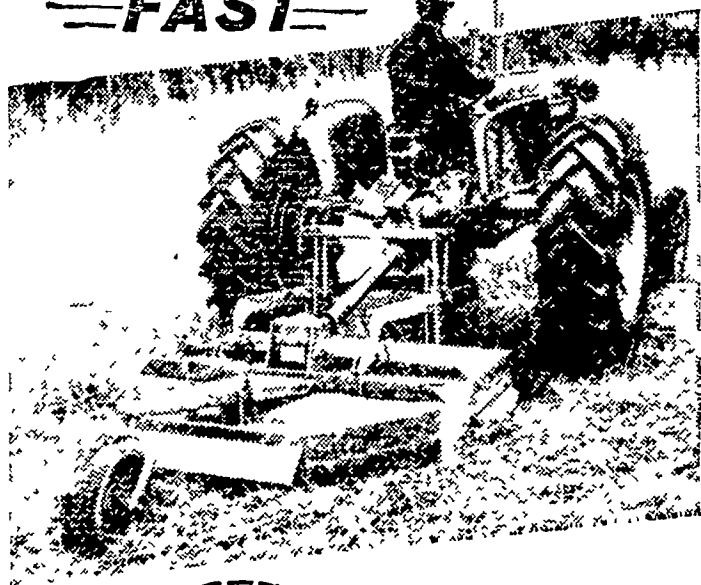
