

Fair Schedule Announced By New Holland

The 28th Annual Farmers Fair in New Holland is being planned for Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Sept. 30, Oct. 1, 2 and 3. The Board of Directors of the Farmers Day Association met recently and voted to give the profits of the 1959 Farmers Fair to the Band Uniform Fund of the Parents Music Club of Garden Spot high school. The parents are taking active parts in various phases of the Fair.

The Young Men's Business League reported on the opening night parade and announced a revised prize list that totals around \$900.

President B. Roy Wimer had charge of the business session. Final details of

many phases of the next Farmers Fair were planned.

Ivan P. Lowry was appointed a committee of one to contact the local business places that furnish display window space for the Farmers Fair.

The directors approved the plans for the amplification system. H. Clair Musselman will take care of the set-up for the Wednesday night parade and other features that night. Joseph L. Fern will play records at two locations on the other nights of the Fair.

Parke Hershey reported on the entertainment feature attractions for the Fair, now less than a month away.

A progress report on the 1959 Premium Booklet was made by Robert O. Whitmore. They were mailed early in September.

Robert J. Wimer made a report on the Kid's Day to be held Friday afternoon of

the Fair.

Carl H. Groff, treasurer of the organization, was asked to check each new bill and requested to pay them as they come in.

Concession Chairman, Geo. D. High, gave a complete report on that portion of the Fair. He outlined various

problems and the way in which they were being handled.

The New Holland Community 4-H Club has forty-two members, according to Hen-

ry M. Seidhof. They will exhibit pigs, flowers, and other projects.

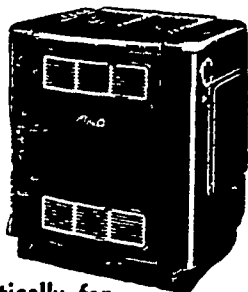
