

Pa. Livestock Exhibition Lists Local Entrants

Pennsylvania Livestock Exhibition officials today announced that more than 30 breeders will show animals in the Nov. 9 through 13 event in the Pennsylvania Farm Show Buildings, Harrisburg. In addition to last-minute entries prior to the Oct. 1st deadline, exhibitors from Lancaster County to date include:

Staufer Homestead Farm, East Earl, 21 Hampshire Swine; 1 truckload Hampshire Swine; 6 Hampshire Swine in Carcass Show. E. Bruce Boyd, Ephrata R1, 1 Angus and 1 Shorthorn Cattle.

Mrs. Milton K. Morgan, Lancaster, 9 Suffolk Sheep. Frey Bros., Quarryville R2,

Angus in Carcass Show. This is the third such open livestock show to be held in Harrisburg. With beef cattle, swine and sheep being exhibited, it has become one of the major livestock events in the eastern United States. The sheep show is the largest indoor show in the nation.

Ben Morgan, show manager, estimates that more than 3,000 head of livestock will be shown.

Carcass classes — classes where market pigs, steers & lambs are judged on foot and then slaughtered and the carcass judged for quality — are being emphasized in the "Keystone International." In this type of competition, not only the animals are judged, but also the ability of a judge to place a live animal on the basis of its meat producing ability.

No admission is charged for attendance at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition which is held indoors in the 14-acre Pennsylvania Farm Show Buildings. The show is sponsored by the State Farm Show Commission in cooperation with the Pennsylvania Livestock and Allied Industries Assn, Inc, and the Pennsylvania Dept. of Agriculture.

BROILERS GROW FASTER ON PELLETS

In a test with 1,800 broiler type chicks, University of Tennessee researchers learned that pelleting improved the growth rate and feed efficiency of broilers. Chicks in the experiment fed a pelleted, high protein, high-energy diet were significantly larger at nine weeks of age. In the pelleted form, chicks needed as little as 2.4 pounds of feed to produce a pound of live broiler. It took 2.6 pounds of the same feed in mash form. In a test using a low-protein, low-energy ration, the chicks on pellets needed 2.7 pounds of feed for a pound of gain compared to 3.1 pounds when fed as mash

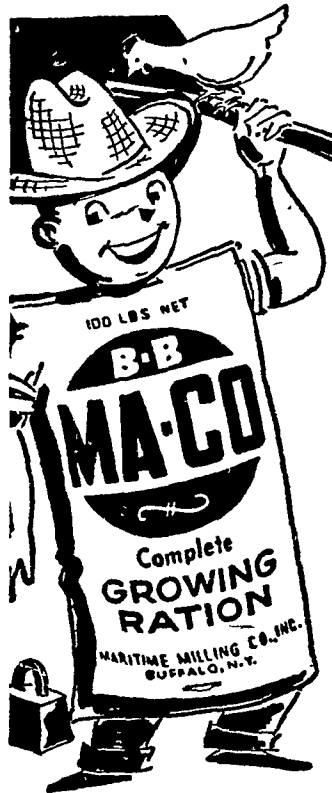
Donald Welk, Strasburg R1 got the nod from the judge for both Grand and Reserve Championships for his pens of 4 fat hogs.

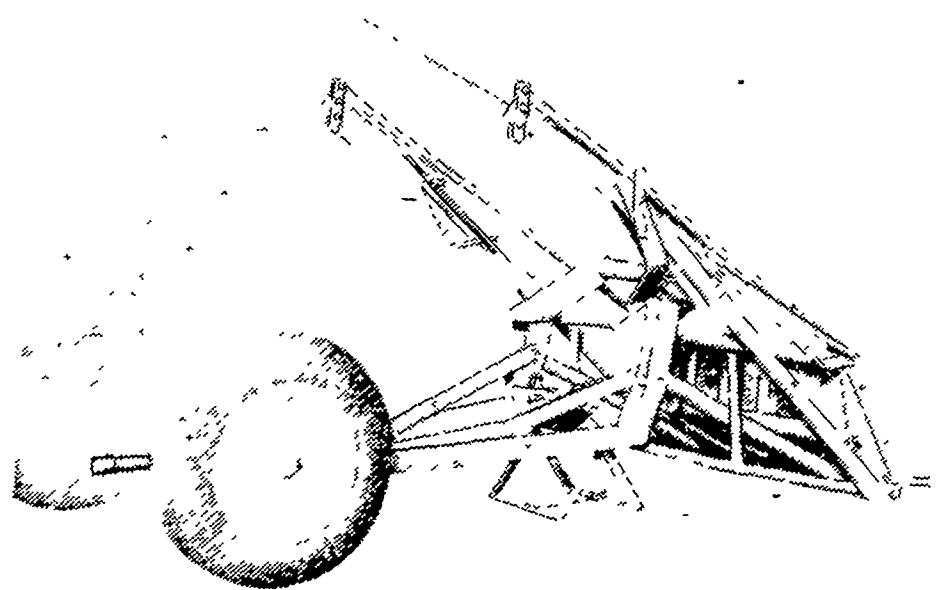
