## New Holland Baby Beef Show Steers Sold

Brother-sister team from Bareville R1, walked off with both Grand and Reserve Championships in the beef show at New Holland Fair Tuesday.

A 1,010 pound hereford named Lucky captured the top prize for his youthful owner, Pearl Lapp, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John David Lapp, brother of Pearl, showed his Angus the number two position and then went on to take championship honors. His finished second in the contest.

According to the rules of the New Holland Baby Beef Show all steers exhibited at the show are sold following the show. The 18 steers in the show weighed a total of 15,000 pounds and registered a price of \$5,131.48. The champion bought by the Holland Sales Stables at the sale was held, brought \$15.10.

The price of the sale last year was the 60 cents a pound. Wesley Mast, Elverson, his Grand Champion yearling average of \$31.57 and redweight was slightly less than the \$32.22 last year.

Twelve year old Bruce Kulp, Manheim R4, showed his second steer, a sleek Hereford, to the Grand Championship at the Manheim Farm Show Wednesday, beating out a six year veteran, Glenn Foreman, of Manheim R3.

Kulp, an eighth grade student at Manheim central school is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Kulp. Last year in his first outing in 4-H competition, he showed his steer to third place in the class at Manheim.

Winner of Reserve honors was Glenn Foreman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Harrison Foreman. At the 1956 Manheim Farm Show, Foreman exhibited the Grand Champion, and then went on to capture the same prize at the State show in Harrisburg. His steer this year was bred by Mark Hosler, Manheim R3, and beat out a half brother, shown by Wilbur Hosler, on the way to the Reserve placing.

Champion for the Shorthorn breed was shown by Terry Petticofer, son of Mr. and Mrs. Amon Petticofer, Elizabethtown R3.

Foreman came back in both the fitting and showmanship contests to place, but the best he could do was second. Top showman of the day was Kenneth Miller, of Manheim R2 who also showed the fattest steer. The fitting trophy went to Marlin Cassel, Manheim R1. Judge was Dauphin County Agent, Harold Stuart.

Judge for this year's National Junior Guernsey Show will be C. R. Knight, Bakersfield, California.

Temperatures will average 2-5 degrees above normal for the next five days. Normal temperature is 51 at night and 71 during the afternoon. Minor day to day temperature with mostly fair skies. Chance of occasional rain Sunday through Wednesday. Less than one third of an inch of rain fell on most of the county during the past week making the total for September less than half the normal amount. Some areas of the county have had above normal rainfall with heavy showers of the past week. September was the warmest in 28 years with temperatures averaging about 5 degrees above normal.

## Co. Beef Tour Is Scheduled

October 15 is the date of the fourth annual Lancaster County Livestock tour for beef feeders and hog producers, County Agent Max Smith announced this week.

Included in the tour, scheduled to leave the CTC bus barns on East Chestnut St., at 7:30 a.m., is a visit to the Consolidated Dressed Beef Company to see slaughter and processing of beef. Hog slaughter and processing of pork will be viewed at the Morrell Phoelin plant, both the above slaughter houses are in Philadelphia.

Afternoon activities will include a trip to the farm of Vincent Neamond, Doylestown, Bucks County to observe a cattle and hog feeding operation. Mr. Neamond each year feeds out 450 steers and 100 hogs on a ration of bread and cracker crumbs supplemented with Urea.

On the return trip, a typical Lancaster County steer feeding operation featuring labor saving devices on the farm of Edward Nolt, New Holland R1, will be visited.

Interested livestock men in the county should make bus reservations with the County Agents office by October 12.
