

4-H Judging Prizes Offered Teams Place At NEPPCO For Clean Stalls

Lancaster County's 4-H poultry judging team ran into tough competition at the Neppco exposition when they finished ninth against teams from the 14-state area Tuesday.

The team, made up of Janice Showalter, Reinholds R1; Paul Shantz, Ephrata R1; Kenneth Porter, Washington Boro R1; and Mary Jane Herr, Refton, was state champion at annual club week at Penn State. New York won the competition in the team judging. Kenneth Porter was high individual scorer in the

Prizes at a livestock show traditionally are awarded to the owners of the animals judged best in their classes, but the "hired hands" at this year's Eastern National Livestock Show will come in for special prizes.

The Poultry marketing demonstration featuring barbecued broilers which won state honors for Kenneth Porter and his brother, Glenn, was presented at the occasion of the awards banquet at the Penn Harris hotel on Tuesday evening. Finding a little easier going than did the judging team, the boys won a blue ribbon for the team and individual plaques for themselves. Two blue ribbons were awarded in the contest which was scored on the Danish system.

The show, fourth largest livestock exposition in the nation, will be held at the Maryland State Fair Grounds at Timonium November 14 through 19.

A prize of \$25 will be awarded to the herdsman who, in the opinion of the judges, keeps the cleanest stalls in the show's cattle barns. An additional prize of \$25 will be offered the county 4-H Club or F.F.A. group which keeps the cleanest stalls for the cattle it is exhibiting.

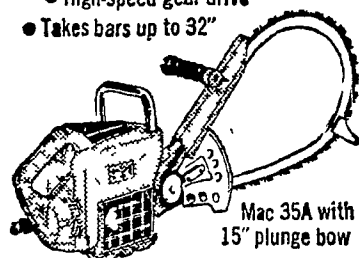
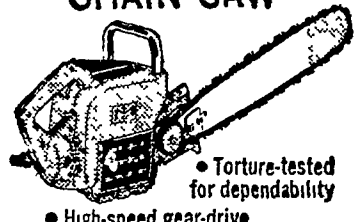
