

Capettes Continue Steady

Broilers sold about steady in the Lancaster Poultry center this week with 93,300 head in 25 lots going at prices of 15.6 to 17.8. Largest capette market remained with 8 lots of 9,200 head going at 25.4 to 27.2.

The only birds listed and sold were three lots of heavy pullets. One lot heavy fowl sold for 16.5, and 25 males went at 15.6.

Trading Steady At DelMarVa

Trading was moderate at Delmarva most of the week with broilers opening at prices ranging from 13.70 thru 17.0 cents. Toward the end of the week the offerings were decreased, but demand was only fair.

Trading closed Friday with 781,900 head going at prices of 14.50 to 15.75. Estimated slaughter for the weekend is 615,000 head.

Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Oct. 2 was 3.4. This is a drop of one point from the 3.5 ratio of last week. Broilers averaged 14.49 this week and mash sold for \$85.80 per ton. Ratio for the comparable week a year ago was 3.5 when the broilers brought 16.42 and feed cost \$94.74.

Georgia closed with 1,530,000 head at prices ranging from 13.50 to 14.50 with most sales at 13.5. Estimated slaughter for the weekend is 1,919,000 head.
