that articles you use most
are easy to reach Discarding
some items may be the an-
swer when you compare the
cost of storing or building
new storage against the val-
ue of the item to be stored.

Making better use of pres-
ent space by adding shelves,
racks, drawers, files or peg-
board can be a solution. You
can also add storage by put-
ting in more closets, built-ins
or storage furniture.

Renting or buying a new
house is the final solution.
This may be the only answer
when you need more room
as well as storage space.

Gladiolus corms should be
dusted with a three to five
per cent DDT before they're
stored for the winter This
protective layer of insecticide
will prevent a buildup of
thrips.

TYPES OF PAINT

The correct type of paint
to use often depends on the
room. Flat paints are usual-
ly good for living and sleep-
ing rooms. Gloss and semi-
gloss paints are fine for
hard duty use in kitchen,
bathroom, and play areas. In
general, the higher the gloss
the more washable a paint
will be.

PORK is the best source of
thiamine, the B. vitamin that
is so essential to healthy
nerves. In this age of pres-
sures, people are concerned
about nervous tension—and
just one serving of pork will
provide 68.7 per cent of the
recommended daily allow-
ance of thiamine for the av-
erage man.
