Delmarva - Georgia Prices Higher Offerings Down

Delmarva opened this week with prices ranging from 14-80 to 15.75 for offerings slightly reduced from last week. The market strengthened somewhat by the mid week point when offerings were somewhat less than demand.

Friday's market closed with 694,200 head at prices of 15.40 to 17. Demand was good, but the buyers were conservative at the higher prices. Estimated slaughter for the week end was 550,700 compared to last week's 615,000

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending on Oct. 9 was unchanged from last week at 3.4. Price paid for broilers rose from 14.49 to 15.18 during the week and mash went from \$85.80 to 90.14 per ton.

Fluid Milk Volume Declines At Phila., Ga.

Declines in the volume of fluid milk were noted at both Philadelphia and Atlanta with New York holding steady. Demand for bottling milk improved at Philadelphia and New York and was good at other points.




