

## Boiler Prices, Supply Up

Boiler prices and prices of broilers were up this week at Lancaster Poultry Center. 123,800 head in 23 lots sold at prices ranging from 16.9 to 18.1 with 88% for 17.6 to 17.9. Only one of the 53 lots offered was not sold.

Broilers lost some ground last week with 19 lots of 885 head selling for 22 to 26. Five lots of 6,200 head fowl brought 8.0 to 10.0 while one lot of 700 head sold for 16.1. A lot of 1,000 males sold for 7 cents.

The sale this week saw over 100 times as many broilers change hands as did the corresponding sale last year in the range in price was up to 17.8.

## Offerings down Prices Improve

Delmarva closed this week with 647,300 head going at prices of 16.3 through 17.65. Estimated slaughter for the week end is 550,000 head.

The market opened Monday with reduced offerings to an unsettled demand. As the week progressed demand was only fair as the offerings remained down. Prices on Monday ranged from 15.5 to 16.9.

The broiler feed ratio for the week ending October 16 was up one point over the previous week at 3.5. Broilers averaged 15.61 and mash sold at \$88.40 per ton. For the comparable week last year the ratio was 3.3 with broilers at 15.55 and mash selling for \$93.70 per ton.

Georgia closed with 2,509,000 head at prices ranging from 15.7 to 16.2. Estimated slaughter for the weekend is 1,325,000 compared to 1,605,000 last week.

Birds not priced prior to the sale at farms were 15.5 to 16 with 99% going for 15.5.

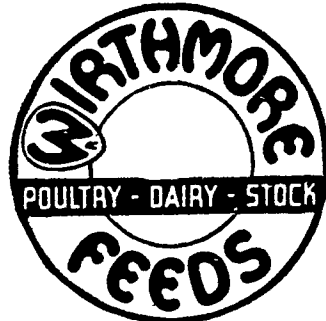

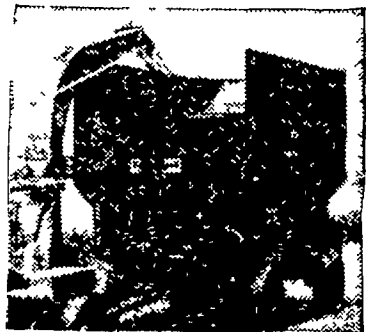
